# **Open Mornings & Class Assemblies**

#### 'Stay and Play' sessions

This term we will be restarting 'Stay and Play' sessions for each class. These sessions will take place at drop-off time and will be an opportunity for you to learn alongside your



child and find out about key areas of the curriculum. Next term we will be focussing on "The Write Stuff", our approach to teaching writing. In the session, you will be able to watch the class teacher teach the children for a short period and then work alongside your child in their task. Previous 'Stay and Play' sessions prior to covid restrictions were very popular with parents as they gave an opportunity to see the learning in context and the expectations for each year group. You only need to attend one session for your child's year group as both sessions will be identical in order to enable us to manage the number of adults in the classroom.
