#### In Memory of Mr Paul Andrews

This week Paul's family visited the school and we discussed plans for developing something special in memory of Paul. As you are aware, Paul was passionate about Forest school and prior to his death he had drawn up his ideas for extending and enhancing Forest School for the future. We have decided that it would be very fitting to take forward some of his ideas and so over the coming weeks and months, we will be sharing his plans with you and organising School Grounds Days, in order that all families who wish to be involved are able to participate alongside the children. In addition, we plan to plant a tree and install a circular bench seat around this with a small plaque dedicated to Paul.





Many families have said that they would like to contribute towards a memorial for Paul. If you would like to donate you can do so via Weduc. We are also happy to take cash and cheque donations (payable to East Preston Infant School), which should be put in a sealed envelope and handed directly into the office. ## 50th Anniversary and Coronation Celebration – save the date!

In May this year the school will be celebrating **50 years** since the Infant School building opened in 1973. As yet we have been unable to establish the <u>exact</u> day, however, we plan to mark this event by becoming 'time detectives' during the week beginning 1<sup>st</sup> May, culminating in a 'Street Party' on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> May, when we will also celebrate the King's Coronation which takes place the following day.

Our 'Street Party' will follow a similar format to our Jubilee Party last year, with the children having lunch on the playground and a show but we also hope to be able to take a whole school aerial photograph in the shape of the number '50' as a record of the event. Parents and carers are welcome to join us on this date again and FEPIS will be asking for volunteers to help set up and clear away again nearer the time.

If you were, or know someone who was a pupil or member of staff at the Infant School in the 1970's and you would be happy to share your memories or photos with the children we would love to hear from you!

#### Spotlight on Safeguarding

E-safety is another part of our safeguarding duty. The internet is a great resource to use in school but it's also important that the children stay safe online.

In school, as part of our computing and PSHE lessons we teach the children how to keep themselves safe online. There are also posters up in all of the classrooms next to the computer areas,

reminding the children how to keep themselves safe online (our E-safety Rules can be viewed on our website) and the teachers give the children reminders when they are using the internet to inform other areas of their learning.
