**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Well what a great afternoon we had with our Coronation and 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations! ## Polite reminders

As you know our playground is very congested at drop off and pick up and so for everyone's comfort and safety we ask that you do not allow your children to do either of these. If your children are 'bored' because they are waiting a long time, it would be better to arrive a few minutes later so that they can go straight into the classroom at 8.50am.

## **Class and Year Group Assemblies**



This term the Year R and Year 1 children are once again holding class assemblies. These are an opportunity for the children to show their work and tell you about what they have been learning in school. Each assembly lasts approximately fifteen minutes. Families are welcome to attend.

Towards the end of term the Year 2 children will be holding a 'Leavers' Assembly to mark the end of their time at the Infant School. Due to space restrictions, the Year 2 Leaver's Assembly is limited to parents and family who have children in that year group.

#### Sports Day – Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> June

Our annual sports day this year will be held on the morning of Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> June. Parents and Carers are invited to attend however space is limited on the field so it really is 'standing room only'.



The children participate in teams made up from children in every year group. They move around a variety of activities where they can all compete at their own level and pace and win points for their team. All children will need to wear their PE kit to school on this day.

The events will start as soon as the children are registered and put into their teams, so this is usually at about 9.30am. We anticipate that we will be finished by 11am. If the weather is poor, the event will sadly have to be cancelled as there are no alternative dates available in the diary. Our thanks, in advance, go to Mr Lake who organises and coordinates this event.

#### Classes for 2023/24

As always, the Year 2 children will remain in their current classes as they transition to the Junior school however, the YR and Y1 children will be mixed in order to rebalance those year groups.

The teachers have already begun to talk to the children about friendships and who they work well with in school, in preparation for next years class organisation. These conversations will take place at least four times over the course of the next few weeks, in order that we can be sure that each child has at least one of the friends that they name in their new class with them. The teachers are very aware of who the children play with during school hours and this may differ from friendships out of school. Parents will be informed about their child's new class and teacher on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July.

## Communication from the school to parents

We appreciate that it can sometimes be confusing knowing the best way to communicate with us and how you can expect us to communicate with you and so we hope that the following helps to provide some clarification.

In simple terms, **there are only two ways in which we send messages to you:** ReachMoreParents by Weduc (for messaging via the office) and Marvellous Me (for messaging from teachers to their class).



# • ReachMoreParents by WeDuc:

This is the main method of communication from the office. It enables us to send out both short message reminders, as well as attachments such as newsletters, flyers and important updates, which need to be shared with the whole school. You do not need to log in to access a message as it arrives in your email box – in this way we are able to ensure that all families receive important information. We are also able to view which families have received messages.

You can also pay for a trip, FEPIS disco ticket etc... as well as complete consent/permission forms which the school may send out for example relating to a sporting event or a survey.

If you have installed the ReachMore Parents by WeDuc app, messages will also appear within this; however, you will still receive an email in your mail box.

## • Marvellous Me:

This app is used by teachers to give virtual badges, stickers and awards to children and to share your child's achievements with you. You will need to have signed up to the app in order to receive these, however once this is done you will be sent a notification if your child has been given an award. Within this app, there is also a communication facility, which teachers sometimes use to send short messages out to their individual class. Again, you will receive a notification via the app if a message has been sent to you. The school will have given you a joining code for this.

## • Google Classroom:

Google classroom is the tool through which home learning is shared. Teachers upload homework and home learning letters onto this each week and children can upload work back for the teacher to see. You will receive a notification when a new home learning letter is uploaded. <u>Teachers do not send out messages via google classroom</u>. You need to log in to this website/app every week in order to see the home learning and to access the home learning letters. The school will have given you a log in and a class code.

## • School News App:

If you have downloaded this app, it is linked to the school website and has an automatic feature that allows you to access **dates of whole school upcoming events**. You will be notified within the app if there are changes to the 'upcoming events' or 'school news' section of the school website. No direct communication is sent to parents via this app.

# Sunny Days!

As the weather begins to turn warmer the children will be spending more time outdoors, so please ensure that your child has a **named sunhat in school every day** – even if it appears cloudy in the morning! In addition,





we would suggest that, if possible, you apply sunscreen at home each day.

Sadly, we are not able to apply sunscreen to the children and although some are capable of doing this themselves, more often than not they end up in a terrible mess and, therefore, we prefer children not to bring sunscreen into school. Thank you.
