Staffing Update

After working with the reception classes for the last year, Mrs Justine Langley will be leaving us and joining the East Preston Junior School team. We are sure you will join us in wishing her well in her new role.

We are pleased to advise that Mrs Leanne Wallace will be joining the reception team in September. Some of you will already know Mrs Wallace as she has been helping in Starlings class, midday meals and her two children are at the school.

Monster Phonics!

The Government now require schools to use an accredited Phonics scheme and therefore, from September, we will be using the 'Monster Phonics' scheme. Having closely examined the wide number of schemes available we have chosen this one because of its practical, interactive and sensory approach which we believe will closely align with our ethos. Our INSET day on 1st September will be for staff training to enable us to begin delivery of this approach to the children. We are currently in the process of purchasing and organising a significant number of resources, including new reading books.



The accredited Phonics schemes all have a different approach to our current way of teaching reading, with the Phonics reading books all needing to be at a fully decodable level for the child. This will have a significant impact on 'reading at home' and there will no

longer be book bands for children to work through. Once we have undertaken our training we will be in a position to give you more information about what this looks like and your role in supporting your child at home.
