Open Mornings & Class Assemblies

'Stay and Play' sessions



Next term we will again be running 'Stay and Play' sessions for each class. These sessions will take place at drop-off time and will be an opportunity for you to see teaching and learning in context and develop more understanding about key areas of the curriculum. This time we will be focussing on Guided Reading using the Monster Phonics programme. The sessions will take place during book week and dates will be confirmed nearer the time.

Year 1 and Reception self-portraits in East Preston Village Library

A collection of self-portraits from East Preston Infant School Reception classes and Year 1 classes 2023-2024 are currently on display in the village library.

Reception children focused on colour mixing by using paint to match their own skin tone. Year 1 were inspired by Pop Art to create these bright representations of themselves.

Spotlight on Safeguarding



Site security is another part of safeguarding. Our safeguarding procedures ensure that only authorised persons are able to gain access to the school and grounds during the school day.

We ensure that the school site is secure, that playground gates are locked once the children have arrived at school and fences are well maintained.

Visitors to the school can only then enter the school site by the pedestrian gates and have to report to the main office. Each visitor has to sign in and is given a visitor badge. Staff would then be alerted if they saw a visitor without a badge and would raise awareness.

Regular volunteers and college/ university students that work in the school have undertaken a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check and have had safeguarding training with one of the DSL (Designated Safeguarding Lead).

BIG Award for Excellence in Challenging Bullying

We are proud to have recently been re-accredited with the 'BIG Award for Excellence in Challenging Bullying'.

This annual assessment ensures that:



- We have a consistent approach towards anti-bullying across the school
- We include the views of all children
- We tailor our provision to match the needs of our school community
- We ensure that children feel safe and know how to share a concern if they have one.

This award reflects our school ethos and links closely with our Rights Respecting Schools work. Thank you to all of those involved in this work.

Learning Outside of the Classroom Silver Re-accreditation



We recently re-applied for the Learning Outside of the Classroom Award (LOtC). The application reflected our daily curriculum and how quality learning beyond the classroom can benefit children's attainment and personal development. By offering these opportunities it allows children to be exposed to the world around them and develop into well rounded citizens.

Following our on-line application, the school was re-awarded 'Silver' Learning Outside the Classroom. The assessor complimented the school on the progress from the last application, with many aspects being graded at 'gold' level.

Thank you to all of our school community who have helped in the work to develop these aspects of our curriculum and we look forward to continuing on our journey in these areas.

Governors' Corner

Junior School Transfer/ Reception 2024

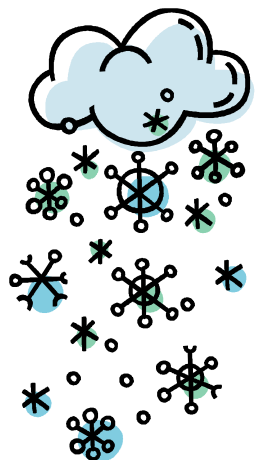

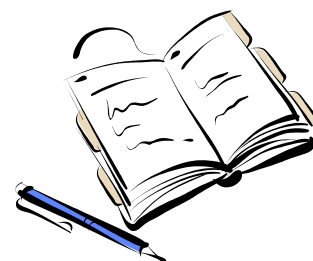
