East Preston Infant School is a Rights Respecting School. All pupils, staff and visitors have the right to be healthy, safe, educated, listened to and treated fairly. These principles are at the heart of our school ethos, and our policies and practices support these rights. We are committed to equal rights, mutual respect and shared responsibility.

East Preston Infant School is committed to supporting Fair trade wherever possible.

In particular the school will:

- Ensure Fair Trade is part of the School Development Plan
- Children are kept regularly informed through assemblies and classroom discussions. We link with rights through Unicef assembly themes
- Where possible use Fair Trade tea, coffee and sugar in the staff room and meetings
- Where possible use Fair Trade ingredients for any cooking activities
- Purchase Fair Trade sports balls when buying new ones
- Ensure Fair Trade is taught as part of appropriate subjects
- Promote Fair Trade within the school community, particularly during Fair Trade Fortnight
- All Fairtrade activities are communicated with parents/carers through the School Newsletter and website

In this Policy we specifically recognise the following articles from the UN convention on the Rights of the Child:

Article 2 – The Convention applies to everyone; whatever their race, religion or abilities, whatever they think or say, whatever type of family they come from.

Article 24 – Every child has the right to the best possible health.
